Yarn (worsted)

Mary Maxim Woodlands



[3.5 ounces, 200 yards

(100 grams, 183 meters) per ball:

Brown Heather

1 skein for Toy - Medium Breed Dogs

2 skeins for Large-Giant Breed Dogs

Crochet Hook

Size H (5.0 mm)

or size needed for gauge

SIZE INFORMATION

Sizes: Toy Breed , Small Breed, Medium Breed, Large Breed, Giant Breed

GAUGE INFORMATION

15 sts and 11 rows to 4" [10 cm] measured over Shell Stitch using **suggested** needles or any size needles which will give the correct stitch gauge.

STITCH GUIDE

ch	chain
st(s)	stitch(es)
SC	single crochet
DC	double crochet
sk	Skip
cm	centimeters
mm	millimeter
rep	repeat



Notes:

This cowl pattern is great for customizing. We recommend you measure the neck circumference and your dogs girth before starting your cowl. We also recommend you select your size based off of your dog's

girth measurements. If you need to adjust your cowl's size we suggest modifying the stitches in your foundation chain and the amount of stitches in each shell.

INSTRUCTIONS:

Work the foundation chain in multiples of 6. We recommend ch 12 for toy breeds, 18 ch for small breeds, ch 24 for medium, ch 30 large breeds and , ch 36 for giant breeds. These are only recommended sizes and this garment can be adjusted to best fit your dogs girth and collar length.

Shell Stitch

Row 1: 5 DC in the 3rd ch from the end, Sc in the 3rd st from the hook (6th ch from the end), 5 DC in the 3rd st from the hook (9th st from the end), SC in the 3rd st from the hook (12th ch from the end. Rep to the end, turn.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as a stitch, now and throughout the pattern), 2 DC into the same st, SC into the 3rd st from the end (the middle st of the shell in the previous row), 5 DC into the 3rd st from the hook (SC in the previous row), rep until the end, 3 DC in the last st, turn.

Toy Breed Dogs

Ch 12 (foundation Ch)

Row 1: SC in each foundation ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 4, DC in 3rd Ch from the end, (Ch1, Sk 1 St, DC) rep. to the end, turn.

Work Shell Stitch: Ch 3, Rep row 1 and 2 of the shell stitch until you have 2 inches (6 rows) end on Row 2 of the shell stitch, then begin shaping for the curve.

Small Breed Dogs

Ch 18 (foundation Ch)

Row 1: SC in each foundation ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 4, DC in 3rd Ch from the end, (Ch1, Sk 1 St, DC) rep. to the end, turn.

Work Shell Stitch: Ch 3, Rep. rows 1 and 2 of the shell stitch until you have 4 inches (12 rows), end on Row 2 of the shell stitch, then begin shaping for the curve.

Medium Breed Dogs

Ch 24 (foundation Ch)

Row 1: SC in each foundation ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 4, DC in 3rd Ch from the end, (Ch1, Sk 1 St, DC) rep. to the end, turn.

Work Shell Stitch: Ch 3, Rep rows 1 and 2 of the shell stitch until you have 6 inches (18 rows) then begin shaping for the curve.

Large Breed Dogs

Ch 30 (foundation Ch)

Row 1: SC in each foundation ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 4, DC in 3rd Ch from the end, (Ch1, Sk 1 St, DC) rep. to the end, turn.

Work Shell Stitch: Ch 3, Rep. rows 1 and 2 of the shell stitch until you have 8 inches (24 rows) then begin shaping for the curve.

Giant Breed Dogs

Ch 36 (foundation Ch)

Row 1: SC in each foundation ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 4, DC in 3rd Ch from the end, (Ch1, Sk 1 St, DC) rep. to the end, turn.

Work Shell Stitch: Ch 3, Rep. row 1 and 2 of the shell stitch until you have 10 inches (30 rows) then begin shaping for the curve.

Shaping for the curve

Toy Breed Dogs

Row 1: CH 1, SC in the back loop only in the next 2 sts, then continue working Shell Stitch, turn

Row 2: Continue working in Shell Stitch in the first 9 st, SC in the back loop only in the last 3 sts, turn

Repeat and work until the ribbed length reaches slightly smaller than the neck circumference 4-8 Inches, then continue in Shell stitch until desired length. We recomend 2 inches.

Small Breed Dogs

Row 1: CH 1, SC in the back loop only in the next 2 sts, then continue working Shell Stitch, turn

Row 2: Continue working in Shell Stitch in the first 15 st, SC in the back loop only in the last 3 sts, turn

work until the ribbed length reaches slightly smaller than the neck circumference 8-14 Inches then, continue in shell stitch until desired length. We recomend 4 inches.

Medium Breed Dogs

Row 1: CH 1, SC in the back loop only in the next 5 sts, then continue working Shell Stitch, turn

Row 2: Continue working in Shell Stitch in the first 18 st, SC in the back loop only in the last 6 sts,

work until the ribbed length reaches slightly smaller than the neck circumference 10-22 Inches then, continue in shell stitch until desired length. We recomend 6 inches.

Large Breed Dogs

Row 1: CH 1, SC in the back loop only in the next 11 sts, then continue working Shell Stitch, turn

Row 2: Continue working in Shell Stitch in the first 18 st, SC in the back loop only in the last 12 sts,

work until the ribbed length reaches slightly smaller than the neck circumference 16-30 Inches then, continue in shell stitch until desired length. We recomend 8 inches.

Giant Breed Dogs

Row 1: CH 1, SC in the back loop only in the next 11 sts, then continue working Shell Stitch, turn

Row 2: Continue working in Shell Stitch in the first 24 st, SC in the back loop only in the last 12 sts,

work until the ribbed length reaches slightly smaller than the neck circumference 24-36 Inches then, continue in shell stitch until desired length. We recomend 10 inches

Finishing your work

Finish your dog cowl by weaving in ends and sewing on buttons (use the Ch1, Sk 1 St, DC as button holes). We used 1 inch buttons that easily slid through our stitches and secured our cowl. We suggest tacking all three sides of the bottom triangle of your cowl so the garment keeps its shape while your dog moves and plays.
