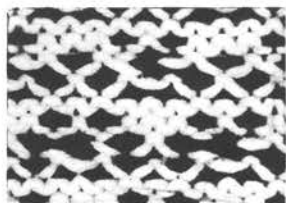

HOW TO WORK DESIGNS

FAIR ISLE KNITTING: (Fig. 1): This method is used when there are two or more colors in one row, but only a few sts. of each color are knitted at a time to make the pattern. It is necessary then that colors not in use be woven along on wrong side of work as follows:

Join on design color, and with main color held taut in left hand, insert point of right-hand needle into next st., the point of right-hand needle passing under main color wool, k. the st. and slip it off needle. Lower main color wool, which is being held in left hand, and k. next st. in usual way. Continue thus along row, remembering always to cross the two wools before changing color in use, to avoid leaving a hole in knitting. For p. rows, follow same method, thus the wool or wools that are not in use are woven along on wrong side of work.

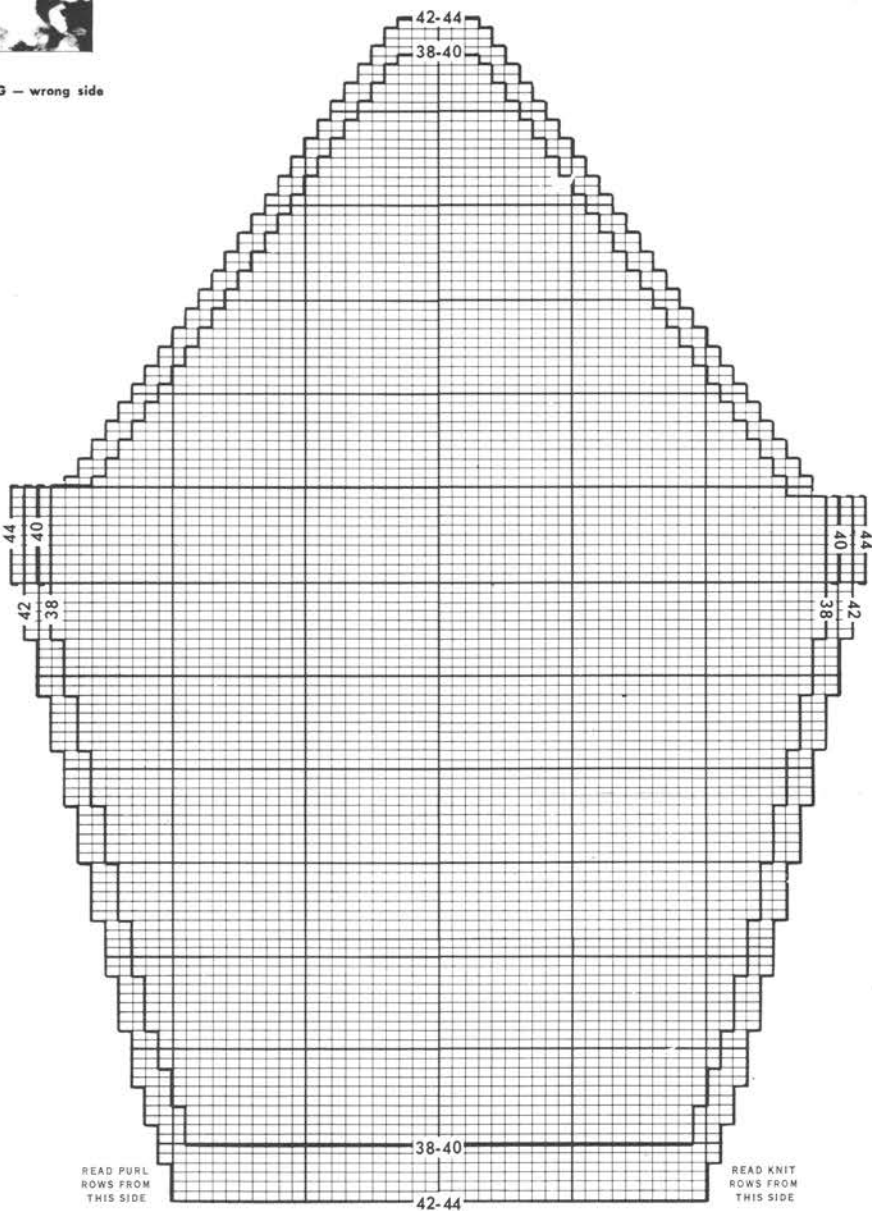
COLORS PATTERN KNITTING: (Fig. 2): Use a separate ball of wool for each colored section of pattern, and for background between design. This method is only for large areas of solid color, it is not necessary to weave colors not in use to the end of rows, just leave them hanging at back of work, when that particular color is finished, to be picked up on the return row. It is very important to cross the two wools when changing from one color to another.

COLLAR:

Using No. 7 needles and M.C. wool, cast on 6 sts.
1st row: K. **2nd row:** right side and outer edge of collar — K.1, inc. one st. in next st., k. to end.
3rd row: K. Rep. 2nd and 3rd rows until there are 16 sts. on the needle, finishing after a 3rd row.
 Work 2nd row, then 3 rows in garter st. Rep. from * to * until there are 21 sts. on the needle.
 Now work 8 (10-10-12) rows of garter st. *****Next row:** K.14; turn, k. to end. Work 4 rows of garter st.***
 Rep. from *** to *** 9 (9-10-10) times more. Work 8 (10-10-12) rows of garter st. Now dec. for other side.
Next row: right side — K.1, k.2 tog., k. to end. Work 3 rows of garter st. Rep. these 4 rows until 17 sts. rem., finishing after a dec. row. **Next row:** K. **Next row:** K.1, k.2 tog., k. to end. **Next row:** K. Rep. the last 2 rows until 6 sts. rem. Cast off.

TO COMPLETE:

Sew in all ends of wool on wrong side. Press work, except collar and ribbing, lightly on wrong side under a warm iron and damp cloth. Join raglan, sleeve and side seams on wrong side, taking one st. from either side, passing bodkin through ridges formed by knitting, making a flat seam. Sew down pocket linings on wrong side. Sew straight side of collar to neck edge of cardigan, joining cast-on and cast-off edges to fronts at neck edge. Place zipper on wrong side of work, line metal edge evenly with front edges, baste zipper in position, matching any design and sew securely.

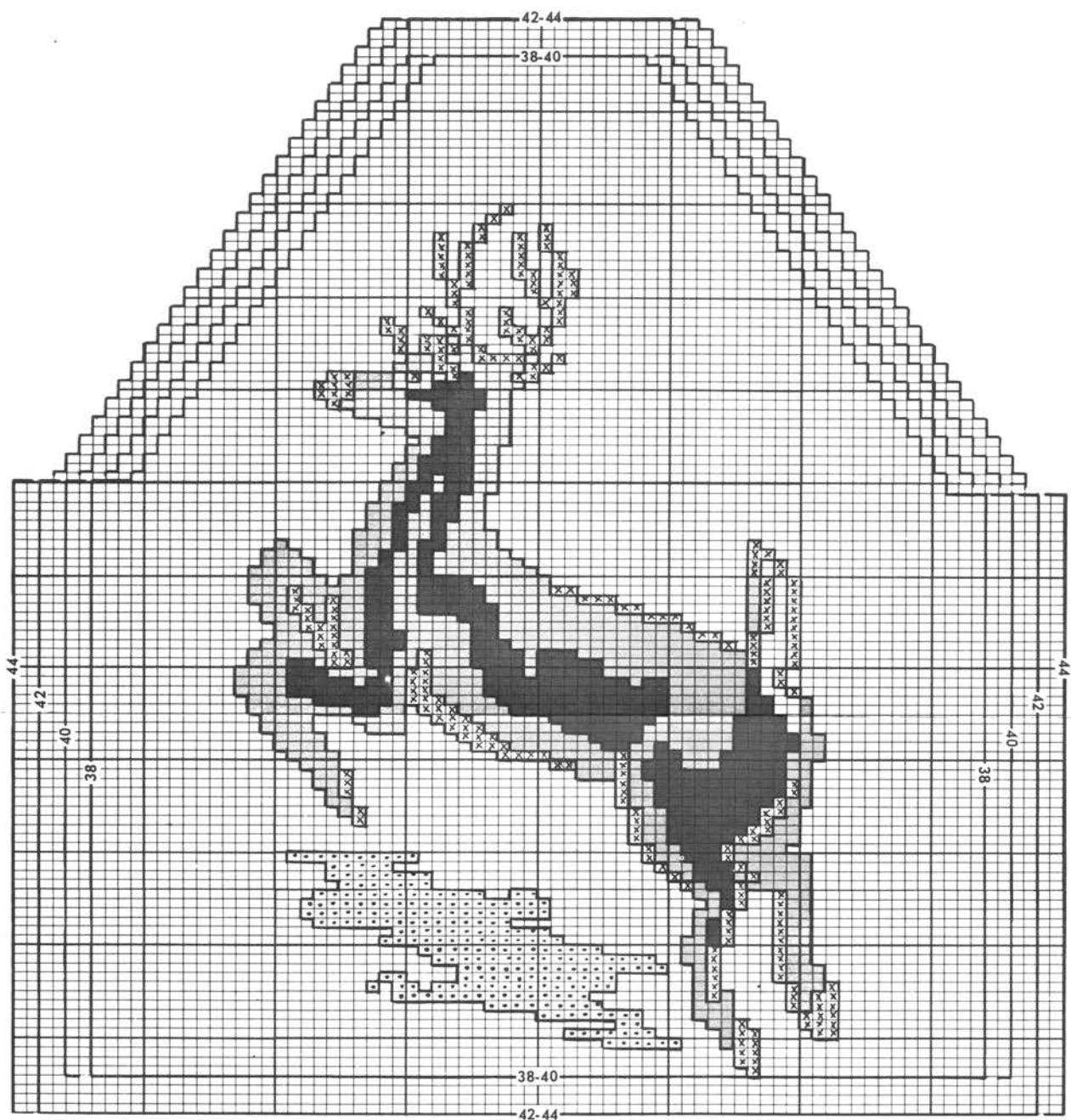


KNIT FIRM RIBBING BEFORE STARTING GRAPH

SLEEVES:

Begin at lower edge, using No. 7 needles and M.C. wool, cast on 38 (38-40-40) sts. and work 3 ins. in k.1, p.1 or 2 in. in k.2, p.2 ribbing. Change to No. 4 needles and st.st. and proceed to work from graph, inc. and dec. as indicated on graph. Cast off on last row.

BACK



KNIT FIRM RIBBING BEFORE STARTING GRAPH

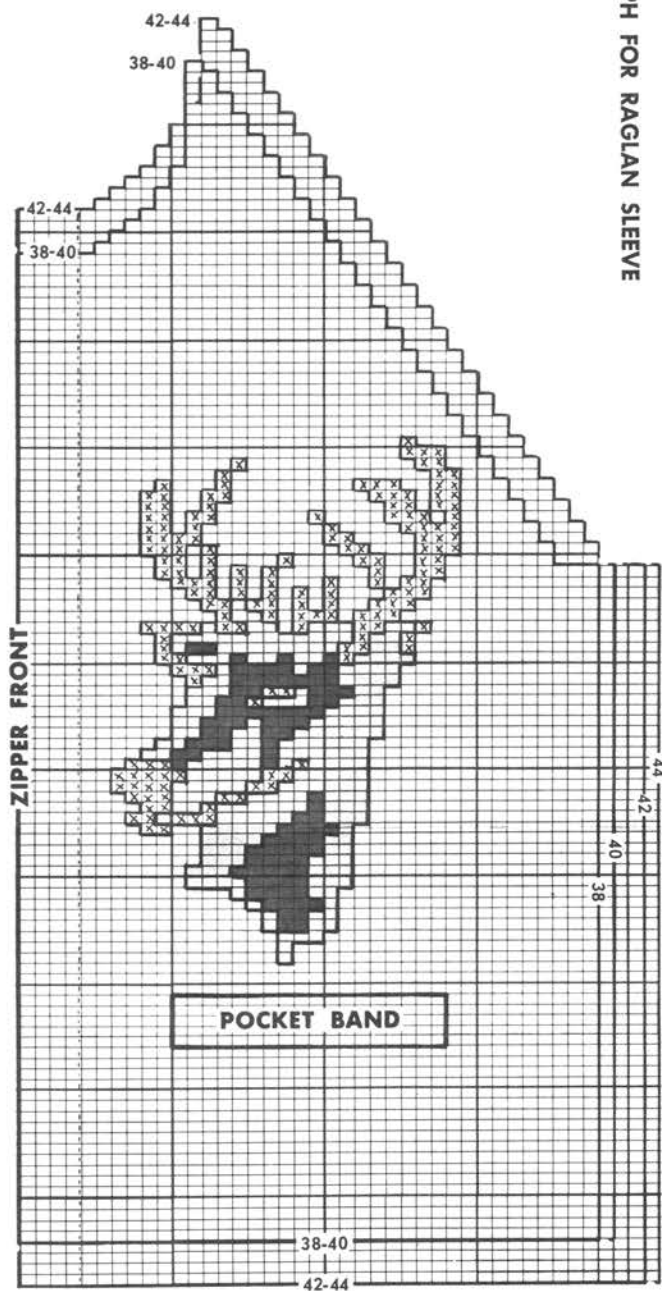
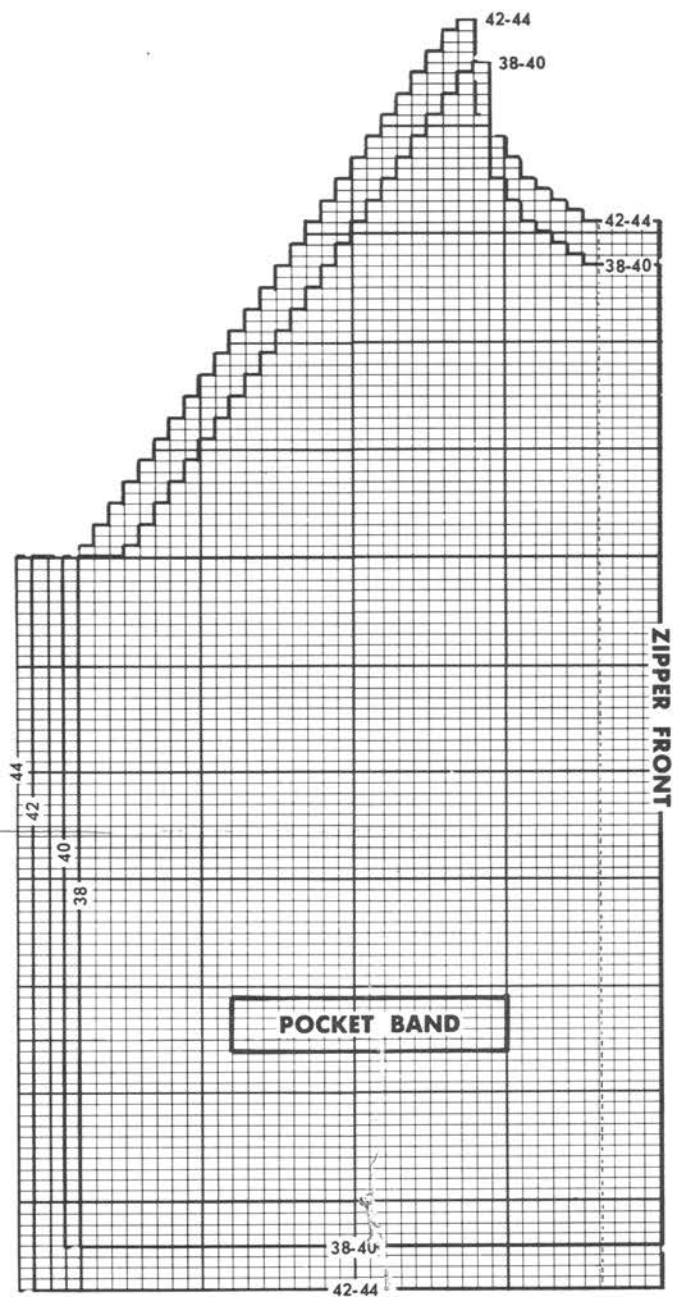
BACK:

Begin at lower edge, using No. 7 needles and M.C. \square wool, cast on 68 (72-76-80) sts. and work 3 ins. in k 1, p 1 or 2 ins. in k 2, p 2 ribbing, if desired. Change to No. 4 needles and st. st. — one row k., one row p. — and proceed to work from graph. Using the "Colored Pattern Knitting" method for working the deer, use a separate ball of M.C. at each end of the row, with small balls or short lengths of the color indicated by symbols for each section of the design, dec. for armholes as required. Cast off on last row.

KNIT FIRM RIBBING BEFORE STARTING GRAPH

RIGHT FRONT:

Begin at lower edge, using No. 7 needles and M.C. wool, cast on 38 (38-40-42) sts. **1st row:** K. 4, * k. 1, p. 1 or k. 2, p. 2; rep. from * to end. **2nd row:** Rib to last 4 sts., k. 4. Rep. these 2 rows until work measures 3 ins. or 2 ins. from the beg., finishing after a 2nd row, inc. 0 (1-1-0) st. at beg. of last rib row — 38 (39-41-42) sts. Change to No. 4 needles and st. st. and proceed to work from graph, always keeping 4 border sts. in garter st. When the 18th (18th-22nd-22nd) row has been completed, then work pocket band. **19th (19th-23rd-23rd) row:** K. 10, p. 18, k. to end. **20th (20th-24th-24th) row:** P. to last 4 sts., k. 4. Rep. these 2 rows once more. **23rd (23rd-27th-27th) row:** K. 10, cast off 18 sts., purlwise, k. to end. Leave this work for the present and work pocket lining.

LEFT FRONT:

Work as given for right front making ribbing to correspond. **1st row:** K. 4, rib in p. 1, k. 1 or p. 2, k. 2 to end. **2nd row:** Rib to last 4 sts., k. 4. Finishing after a 1st row, inc. 0 (1-1-0) st. at end of last row — 38 (39-41-42) sts. Working design in the same manner as described for back, complete as for right front.

Pocket Lining:

Using No. 4 needles and M.C. wool, cast on 18 sts. and work 23 (23-27-27) rows in st. st., beg. and finishing with a k. row. Return to right front. **24th (24th-28th-28th) row:** P. to pocket opening, p. sts. from pocket lining, p. to last 4 sts., k. 4. Continue to work from graph, dec. for armhole and neckline as indicated. Fasten off.

GAUGE: 3½ stitches and 5 rows to one inch measured over stocking stitch on No. 9 needles, or any size needles which will give the correct stitch gauge.

ABBREVIATIONS: K., knit; p., purl; st., stitch; sts., stitches; rep., repeat; rem., remain or remaining; beg., begin or beginning; inc., increase or increasing; dec., decrease or decreasing; tog., together; ins., inches; cast off, **bind off**; st.st., stocking or **stockinette stitch**; M.C., Main Color; C.C., Contrast Color.

NOTE: Instructions are given for size 38 and for remaining sizes in the brackets following. Where only one set of instructions is given, this will apply to all sizes.

Each square on graph represents a stitch. Changes in color are shown with different symbols. Follow graph from right to left for knit rows, from left to right for purl rows. When graph shows an extra square, increase one stitch; one less square, decrease one stitch. Decreases of more than one stitch must be cast off at beginning of row. Stitches must be either knit or purl as they are cast off. This will account for one row of squares. Ribbing is not included but is explained in the instructions.
